

Nelson Mandela Bay declared a coronavirus hotspot



Nelson Mandela Bay has been declared a coronavirus hotspot due to the significant **increase in coronavirus infections during the past 14 days**

To contain the spread of the virus and save lives, **additional restrictions on movement, alcohol consumption and gatherings** will apply

A resurgence plan is being implemented to strengthen **health capacity**, expand community **screening and testing**, and increase **contact tracing and isolation**

With effect from **4 December**, the following additional restrictions will apply in Nelson Mandela Bay:

EXTENDED CURFEW



- **Extended curfew** from 10pm to 4am
- Apart from **permitted workers**, no person may be outside their place of residence during curfew
- **Non-essential establishments**, including restaurants and bars, must be **closed during curfew hours**

With effect from **4 December**, the following additional restrictions will apply in Nelson Mandela Bay:



ALCOHOL

- Alcohol sales from retail outlets **restricted to Monday-Thursday, 10am to 6pm**
- **No on-site consumption of alcohol** at licensed establishments **after 10pm**
- **No consumption of alcohol in public spaces**, including parks and beaches

Nelson Mandela Bay declared a coronavirus hotspot



With effect from **4 December**, the following additional restrictions will apply in Nelson Mandela Bay:



GATHERINGS

- Gatherings – including religious gatherings – **may not exceed 50% of venue capacity**, up to a maximum of 100 people indoors and 250 outdoors
- **Health protocols must be observed** at gatherings, including maintaining a distance of at least 1.5 metres between people
- **All post-funeral gatherings are prohibited**

South Africa will remain on Level 1

The following restrictions remain in place for the rest of the country:



The number of people allowed in a retail store, bar, cinema, theatre or other public space remains **limited to 50%** of its normal capacity



Gatherings are limited to 250 people indoors and 500 outdoors



It is mandatory to **wear a mask** in all public spaces and to **ensure social distancing**



A **curfew** remains in place from **12 midnight to 4am**

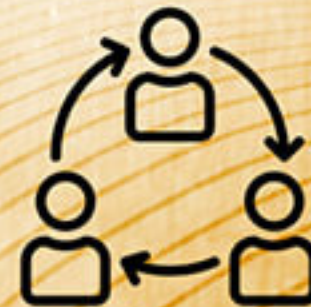
