Ongoing monitoring of the number and severity of cases in every province and district



Prioritising the protection of healthcare and frontline workers



Ensuring that adequate healthcare capacity is in place for areas of high transmission



Special precautions for those above 60 and those with underlying medical conditions









The next stage of South Africa's response

A differentiated approach will mean:



Targeted interventions to contain outbreaks at a local level



Returning to a higher alert level in certain areas if necessary



Fewer restrictions in most of the country, where the rate of infection is low

This means that all economic activity is allowed to resume, with some exceptions









South Africa will be placed on alert level 3 from 1 June

This means that all economic activity is allowed to resume, except for:



Consumption of food and alcohol in restaurants, bars, shebeens and taverns



Gyms and fitness centres



Cinemas, theatres, museums and entertainment venues



Personal care services, where social distancing is not possible



Hotels and accommodation for leisure



Conferences, events and gatherings









South Africa will be placed on alert level 3 from 1 June





You must remain at home, except to travel to work, purchase goods, exercise and seek medical care



People can leave home to attend school or other educational institutions when these re-open



are permitted



You should **not visit family or friends,** to protect them in case you are infected









South Africa will be placed on alert level 3 from 1 June



This means that:





Alcohol will be sold under strict conditions, on specified days



The sale of cigarettes and tobacco products remains prohibited

This means that:





Restaurants may open for delivery, collection and drive-through, but may not serve food on the premises









South Africa Alert Level 3

Closure of borders



All borders of the Republic remain closed, except for the transportation of goods and repatriation of citizens









South Africa Alert Level 3

Special measures will apply in hotspot areas, with more than five infections per 100,000 in the population:



There will be certain restrictions on movement in hotspot areas



Each hotspot will be linked to testing and quarantine facilities, and additional hospital beds



teams will be deployed to contain the outbreak



All contacts will be traced and isolated to prevent further transmission









South Africa Alert Level 3

Creating a safe workplace | To keep workers safe, employers must:



Make arrangements for social distancing at work



Provide sanitiser or facilities for hand-washing



regularly

Screen employees for symptoms daily and assist those at risk to seek treatment









Play your part, stay safe



At Level 3, we need to take personal responsibility for our safety and the safety of others:



Keep a distance of 11/2 metres from other people



Wash or sanitise your hands regularly



Clean surfaces regularly



Wear a cloth mask in public



Avoid crowds and gatherings

Special measures for the most vulnerable:



All those above the age of 60, and those with underlying medical conditions, should leave home only in exceptional circumstances



to work from home where possible, or put special measures in place to facilitate their safety at work
