In 2002 he became the second living poet, and the only black poet, to be published in the Penguin Modern Poetry series.[1][2] His performance poetry involves the recitation of his own verse in Jamaican patois over dub reggae usually written in collaboration with renowned British reggae producer/artist Dennis Bovell. Linton Kwesi Johnson will do a talk and have a poetry workshop and reading with students and a general audience at the Luthuli Museum in KwaDukuza. There will also be a musical performance and other poets in attendance and participating.
28 MAY 2019	Africa Month Colloquia: Lecture	Gauteng	Literature Panel and Music:The Africa month lecture focuses on African solidarity: strengthening the African agenda between Africa and its Diaspora in the arts, culture, language and the environment. The 2019 Africa Month lecture will be a talk presented by Linton Kwesi Johnson. He will speak on the theme "Celebrating African Literary Legends."This session will also feature the work and life contribution of living literary legend, Don Mattera, born in 1935, who will be part of a reading panel that will include Mxolisi Nyeswa, Frank Meintjies and Sindiwe Magona. Don Mattera is renowned as an artist who became involved in the Black Consciousness movement, helped form the Union of Black Journalists and













			became known for his poetry and his autobiography, "Memory is a Weapon". Once more a range of literary legends and those of younger generations have been invited to pay tribute to him and to celebrate the lives of other authors.
